

Voting FAQs

What you need to know to vote in the Nov. 3 General Election

Register to vote

- ★ **Online:** Go to tinyurl.com/MIOneRegistration before Oct. 19
- ★ **Mail:** Download an application at tinyurl.com/MIMailBallot must be postmarked by Oct. 19
- ★ **Visit your county, city, or township clerk's office:**
Anytime before 8 p.m. on Election Day

Check if you are registered to vote

- ★ **Go online to:** tinyurl.com/MICheckRegistration

Get an absentee ballot

- ★ **Go online and fill out the form at:**
tinyurl.com/MIAbsenteeAppOnline before Oct. 30
- ★ **Call your city or township clerk before 5 p.m. on Oct. 30**
and ask that an application be mailed to you
- ★ **Visit your clerk's office before 4 p.m. on Nov. 2**
to request an absentee ballot
- ★ **Download an application at tinyurl.com/MIAbsenteeApp**
to return by mail or in person to your local clerk
- ★ **When is the deadline for an absentee ballot?** Must be received
by city or township clerk by 8 p.m. on Election Day, Nov. 3

The Secretary of State's office recommends absentee voters mail their ballots by Oct. 19, at least two weeks ahead of the November election.

- ★ **Check if your ballot was received:** Go line to tinyurl.com/MIBallotCheck

- ★ Drop off absentee ballot applications before 5 p.m. Oct. 30
- ★ Drop off absentee ballots before 8 p.m. on Election Day

Election Day, Nov. 3

- ★ Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. If you are in line when the polls close, you will be allowed to vote.
